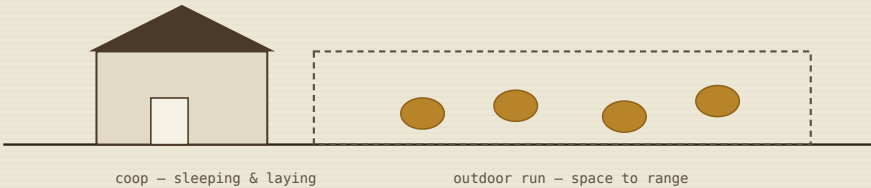

01 More room than chickens

Turkeys grow considerably larger than chickens and need proportionally more space in both shelter and run to stay healthy and avoid injury from crowding.



02 Housing & setup

SHELTER	Sturdy, weatherproof shelter with roosts strong enough for a large bird.
FENCING	Secure, taller fencing — turkeys can fly reasonably well when young.
BEDDING	Deep litter, changed regularly.

04 Health & problems

- **Blackhead disease** — a serious parasite risk, especially if housed with or after chickens; avoid shared ground.
- **Cold/wet sensitivity in poults** — keep young birds warm and dry.
- **Predator loss** — secure housing overnight.
- **Injury from crowding** — ensure adequate space as birds grow large.

03 Daily care

- Feed a turkey-specific grower ration — chicken feed alone isn't sufficiently high in protein.
- Provide ample space to reduce pecking and injury.
- Keep young poults warm and dry — they're more delicate than chicks.
- Plan processing timing around a target date (e.g. a specific occasion).

05 Production & harvest

PROCESSING AGE	16–24 weeks depending on breed and target size.
YIELD	Often 5–10kg dressed weight depending on breed and sex.
METHOD	On-farm or licensed processor, as with meat chickens.
STORAGE	Fresh in the fridge a few days; freezes very well for months.

06 Compatibility & considerations

GOOD WITH	AVOID KEEPING WITH	NOTE
Standalone housing away from chicken flocks	Sharing ground with chickens (blackhead disease risk)	Avoid running turkeys on ground previously used by chickens, due to the blackhead disease risk carried by chicken-associated parasites.
